


Many Women Don't Know the Signs and Symptoms¹


Common signs and symptoms to watch out for include:

PELVIC OR ABDOMINAL PAIN




TROUBLE EATING OR FEELING FULL QUICKLY



FEELING THE NEED TO URINATE URGENTLY OR OFTEN


There Are Different Classifications²

Ovarian cancer that returns after platinum-based chemotherapy can be classified in two ways:



PLATINUM-RESISTANT

When a relapse happens less than 6 months after the last chemotherapy treatment



PLATINUM-SENSITIVE

When a relapse happens at least 6 months after the last chemotherapy treatment
